RULES AND REGULATIONS
OF THE GUELPH
FARMERS AND MECHANICS' INSTITUTE.

LIBRARY.

1.—The Library shall be open every day for the delivery and exchange of Books to *Country* members—and every evening except Saturday, from 7 to 9½, to *all* members.

2.—That no member shall be entitled to draw a book from the Library until he shall have paid all sums due by him to the Institute, and made good all damages and losses that he may have occasioned.

3.—That every qualified member may receive, on application to the Librarian, one volume at a time, and such volume can only be retained for *two weeks*; but any member may have the privilege of renewing his loan of a book for three successive weeks, provided no application has been made by another member for the same.

4.—That no person shall have more than one volume in his possession, except some other may be obviously necessary for its proper elucidation.

5.—That any member who shall detain a book longer than the time above limited, shall forfeit and pay to the Librarian, one penny for each day a book or pamphlet is so detained.

6.—That if any member lose or injure a book, he shall make the same good to the Library; and, if the book lost or injured be one of a set, he shall pay to the Librarian for the use of the Institute, the full value of said complete set, and may thereupon receive the remaining volumes as his property.

7.—That no member shall lend a book belonging to the Institute to any person out of the dwelling-house or counting-room of said member, under a penalty of one shilling and three pence, currency.

8.—That each member on taking a book shall give (if required) security to the amount of one pound ten shillings, currency, for the safe return of the same.

9.—To enable the Committee to ascertain the state of the Library, and condition of the Books therein, the circulation of the Books shall cease for two weeks immediately prior to the Annual Meeting, (the second Tuesday in January,) at which period all Books must be returned to the Library; and any member detaining a book beyond this period, shall be fined 6d. for every day it is so detained.

10.—Numbers of Periodical Works shall not be circulated until the next succeeding number shall have appeared.

11.—Works of Value and of Reference, of which a List shall be kept by the Librarian, not to be removed save by permission of the Librarian.

READING ROOM.

1.—Any member may introduce a Stranger, not resident in the Town, to the Reading Room for a period of one week; the name of such Visitor, with that of the member introducing him, being first entered in a Book provided for that purpose.

2.—No member shall be allowed to take any publication from the Reading Room, without the assent of the Librarian.

3.—Any member tearing or otherwise injuring any Book, Periodical, or Newspaper, belonging to the Library or Reading Room, shall be fined in proportion to the damage.

4.—No member in the Reading Room shall retain a Newspaper longer than 15 minutes after it has been applied for by another member; the first applicant to have the first perusal of the said Newspaper.

5.—Members while in the Reading Room shall observe strict order and decorum; they shall not engage in any conversation so as to distract the attention of Readers.

The Reading Room shall be open every evening from 7 to 9½ o'clock, except Saturday.
